



50 shades of... green

During the construction of the Mülheimer Brücke in 1929, the Mayor Konrad Adenauer wanted to create a new shade of green (yes, what a legacy), and that led to invention of the "Kölner Brückengrün" (Cologne Bridge-Green), or "Kölner Grün" (Cologne Green).

Five of the eight bridges in Cologne that crossing the river Rhine were later painted this green colour. Today, only the four bridges maintained by the City of Cologne (Mülheim, Severins-, Zoo and Deutzer) are still covered in this iconic green – in fact they are not allowed to be painted in any other shade.

2 "Fat Peter"

Petersglocke, the bell located in the Cathedral of Cologne, is the second largest-swinging bell in the world. It was made in 1923, and it weighs an impressive 24.0000 Kg.

The bells of the cathedral only rings on special occations, and Fat Peter gets a 10 minute solo before any other bell starts ringing.

Bonus: You can fine a shrine of The Three Wise Men in the Cathedral.

Get a smell of Cologne

The House of 4711 is home to the original "Eau de Cologne" and offers visitors the chance to discover the craft that lays behind the creation of our favourite bottled odours. The art of fragrance production in Cologne dates back over two centuries.

During World War II, Germany's navy issued vast amounts of 4711 perfume to the submariners of their U-boat fleet. As there were few opportunities for bathing, the scent was to be used in an attempt to improve the scents aboard the vessels.

4 A more delicious skyline

At the busy Neumarkt Square, a different type of spire competes for attention with the many church spires in sight. A 10-meter-tall, upside-down ice cream cone sculpture is deliciously dangling from the corner of the Neumarkt Gallery.

Created by artists Claes Oldenburg and Coosje van Bruggen, the two where inspired by the waste amount of ice cream places in the city along with the fact that the word Cone can be created by letters from the city name.

With its 103 meters, Köln Triangle is an impressive building and a great place for wonderful panoramic views of the city. While most floors function as the headquarter of the European Aviation Safety Agency, the top floor is open to the public.
